### FLOWERS continued

#### SECTION N: INDIVIDUAL ROSE

*(see arrangement division for multiple display. Two sets of leaves are to be showing above mouth of container)*

- Class N 1: Large flower rose, hybrid tea form, (1 bloom)
- Class N 2: Large flowered rose, fully open, stamens must show (1 bloom)
- Class N 3: Large flowered rose, Many petalled (1 bloom) "David Austen"
- Class N 4: Large flowered rose, cluster (1 spray)
- Class N 5: Climbing Rose (1 bloom or spray)
- Class N 6: Old Garden (Old fashion) rose, (one bloom or spray)
- Class N 7: Miniature rose, (1 bloom or spray)
- Class N 99: Any other rose not listed (1 bloom or spray)



**SECTION O: POTTED PLANT(S)** *(potted plant(s) should have been in possession of the exhibitor at least six months and in a container. Bonsai entries must be at least three years old and trained by the exhibitor for at least two years)*

- Class O 1: Any blooming plant,(s) shown in bloom
- Class O 2: Any blooming plant(s) ; not in bloom
- Class O 3: Any non-blooming foliage plant
- Class O 4: Any cacti
- Class O 5. Any succulent
- Class O 6: Any bonsai
- Class O 99: Any other potted plant(s) not listed

#### **TIPS FOR HORTICULTURE SUCCESS:**

*Success depends upon having good quality specimens, how strong the competition is and showmanship,. Showmanship is presenting your specimen to look its best but not to look artificially enhanced.*

#### **TIPS FOR VEGETABLES:**

Select those that are **uniform in size**, shape, color and maturity.

Free from insect or other damage with stems removed or intact and trimmed as noted by this schedule

Clean and not overly mature

#### **TIPS FOR FLOWERS:**

Choose a container that shows off your flower, but not over shadows it

Pleasing length of stem to size of flower

You may use wedges, cut Styrofoam, Oasis to hold your flower in place [wire and tape are not permitted]

Choose a flower that is at the peak of maturity
